Spending and impact report 2017- 2018

From September 2013 the Government provided additional funding to schools to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. The Government is not dictating how schools should spend this money however schools will be accountable for how they spend their additional funding. In 2017 the sports premium funding is due to increase to £16,270. For the academic year 2017- 2018 the school will receive a total of £14,615.00 sports funding.

In the academic year 2017- 2018 the funding will be spent in the following ways:

- Hiring specialist qualified sports coaches to teach gymnastics and games across EYFS & KS1 alongside the teachers.
- Specialist qualified sports coaches and the PE coordinator to provide guidance, support and feedback to all teachers through a well-planned CPD programme
- Ensure that continuing professional development opportunities are provided for all teachers and support staff through regular training led by coaches and the PE coordinator.
- PE coordinator to work closely alongside coaches to ensure a broad, balanced and progressive curriculum is planned and delivered across the school, including the development of a PE scheme of work.
- Continue to ensure that accurate assessment of gymnastics skills is in place to ensure pupils are progressing across the British Gymnastic Association stages.
- The employment of a member of staff who will work with pupils to maintain the school grounds and deliver cooking sessions with a focus on healthy eating.
- Subside after school clubs focussing on healthy eating such as healthy heroes
- To hire a specialist sports coach to encourage active lunchtimes by participating in sports e.g. football
- Subsidise after school clubs led by Fiscal Sports.

OFSTED will evaluate the impact that the sport's funding has had on pupils' lifestyles and physical well-being.

Pupils in the EYFS receive high quality gymnastics sessions on a weekly basis, which has impacted on their physical development. 	<p><i>Gymnastics coaching has proved successful outcomes for all pupils.</i></p> <p>This is evidenced by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Teachers feel confident in delivering PE sessions alongside the gymnastics coach and when team teaching together. *All pupils at the end of Year 2 achieved Level 7. *All pupils in Year 1 achieved Level 8 of the core proficiency award. *All UFS pupils achieved step 1 of the Pre-school awards. *Evidence has been collected for the pupils in EYFS to inform judgements against the EYFSP. *TA within school has become a qualified Gymnastics judge and coach and offers ongoing support to UFS and KS1. *Pupils in the EYFS achieved well at the end of the EYFS with 86% reaching a GLD in moving and handling and 80% reaching a GLD in Health and self-care. This has improved from their starting points on entry to the EYFS where 67% of pupils were at the age related expectations in their physical development.

Future spending: The school will continue to use the sports funding to provide specialist gymnastics sessions for all pupils and through this, continue to provide all teachers with high quality CPD. Teachers will continue to teach alongside specialist sports coaches to further develop their own PE teaching. Specialist sessions will take place at the Normanton sports acro centre. The school will continue with the assessment for proficiency badges and will ensure the children have the opportunity to perform their gymnastics routines through events such as gym fusion.

Sports skills are taught progressively and children are challenged during PE sessions. Pupils receive high quality PE provision in a range of games skills delivered by specialist coaches. Full coverage of the National Curriculum across sport and agility. Teachers and support staff have supported PE lessons and teachers and NQTs have taught alongside the specialist games coach. Assessment opportunities are developing in games. 	<p><i>Specialist games coaching has proved successful outcomes for all pupils.</i></p> <p>This is evidenced by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Teachers feel confident in delivering PE sessions alongside the sports coach and when team teaching together. *Specialist coaches have ensured that full coverage of the NC has been in place. Pupils have had the opportunity to develop the full range of skills across a broad range of games, including hockey, football, tennis and basketball. *Pupils enjoy games sessions with the specialist coaches. *Pupils have participated in a range of sporting events and competitions and continue to perform well and demonstrating excellent attitudes to sport/sportsmanship. *Pupils are provided with a range of sports after school clubs led by staff and specialist coaches (which are subsidised) for example hockey, netball, multi sports, yoga, dance, cheerleading and athletics.
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Future spending: The school will continue to use the sports funding to provide specialist games coaching for all pupils in KS1 and the EYFS. This will also include delivery of targeted sessions in the EYFS focusing on developing gross and fine motor skills. In 2018 - 19 the funding will also be spent to provide the PE coordinator and PE team time to devise a long term and medium term plans for PE and develop assessment systems with exemplification videos for teachers and support staff to use. The school will also use the sports funding to deliver after school sporting opportunities.

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Future spending: The school will continue to develop the role of the caretaker in the development of the school grounds and cookery programs. The allotment will continue and the breadth of cookery sessions expand. The use of this nurture provision for vulnerable pupils will be sharply focused and will impact positively on pupils SEMH.

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Future spending: The school will continue to develop the role of the games/sports leader at lunchtimes further developing the games and sports played during these times.
