

Our consequences

Supervised play

For incidents of unacceptable behaviour particularly at playtimes and at lunchtimes pupils may be assigned to supervised play. The are stages of supervised play are:

- Supervision during a game led by an adult
- Supervision in a small group in the quiet zone
- One to one supervision with an adult.

When pupils have accessed supervised play this is logged and the outcomes recorded.

Individual behaviour charts and plans

If pupils are struggling in school to manage their own feelings and behaviours they may be given a behaviour chart or individual behaviour system to use that will be explained to the child and parents by the class teacher.

Informing parents

It is crucial that school and home work together to ensure a consistent approach to behaviour. It is important that parents are made aware of any behaviour issues that may have occurred that day. The class teacher may ask to speak to you at the end of the school day or they may telephone you and ask you to come into school and meet with them before school finishes.

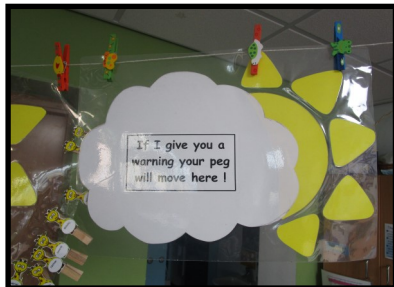

Our rewards

The cloud system

All our classrooms have the same consistent behaviour system. This includes the four step cloud system. All children have a peg and start the day on the sun, if they do something cool at school that day they go up the chart and receive a cool at school slip during candle time. If a child makes the wrong choice they will be given a warning, and their peg will move to the cloud. If they have to be reminded again about their behaviour their peg will move to the raincloud and they will have to miss some minutes of their playtime. This time builds from foundation stage where pupils lose 3 minutes of their choosing time and KS1 where pupils lose 5 minutes of their play/lunchtime. Once their missed time is completed their peg moves back to the sun and they have the opportunity to start again.



Good Manners tokens

In school we are always eager to encourage our pupils to use good manners. All adults across the school are able to award pupils with a good manners token. These are given for demonstrating excellent manners for example opening doors for others, using superb manners during collective worship. These tokens are collected during the week and a prize is chosen for a child in each year group every Friday.



The Headteachers Award

On a weekly basis our Headteacher, Mrs Stone presents a pupil with her Headteachers award. This is presented to a pupil who is always trying hard to make the right choices and do the right thing. They also try very hard with their learning back in the classroom. As a special treat they share a hot chocolate with Mrs Stone after assembly that day.

Celebration assembly

On a weekly basis we meet together as a school family to celebrate our children's achievements. Children and staff are chosen on a weekly basis to be in the golden book and receive a certificate.

Golden table

During lunchtime we have the golden table available for our pupils to eat at. Each day they are accompanied by a member of staff who enjoys eating lunch with the pupils on the golden table. Our midday supervisors are always on the look out for excellent lunchtime manners. These are presented on Friday in our celebration assembly.
