PE & Sports Funding Grant

Proposed Spending 2018- 2019

From September 2013 the Government provided additional funding to schools to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. The Government is not dictating how schools should spend this money however schools will be accountable for how they spend their additional funding. The school receives a total of sports premium funding £17,740.

In the academic year 2018 - 2019 the funding will be spent in the following ways:

- Hiring specialist qualified sports coaches to teach gymnastics and games across EYFS & KS1 alongside the teachers and support staff. This will improve pupils' knowledge, skills and understanding across the different strands of PE and will allow them to achieve highly.
- Ensure that continuing professional development opportunities are provided for all teachers and support staff through regular training and joint teaching led by coaches and the PE coordinator. This will improve the staff's knowledge, understanding and skills in teaching PE.
- PE coordinator and team to work closely alongside coaches to ensure a broad, balanced and progressive curriculum is planned and delivered across the school. This will include a whole school project for PE to increase staff's knowledge, understanding and skills in the teaching and assessment of PE and to ensure that there is clear progression across the school.
- PE coordinator and team to work alongside other coordinators in the All Saints' partnership to plan and lead a range of sporting activities for pupils in Year 2 to participate and compete in alongside other schools. This project will also help build children's confidence and self-esteem.
- Continue to ensure that accurate assessment of gymnastics skills is in place to ensure pupils are progressing across the British Gymnastic Association stages and are achieving well.
- Involvement of pupils, alongside the caretaker, to maintain the school grounds including the growing and cooking of a range of different healthy food choices and meals. This will also include a nurture group to focus on pupils' physical development but also their personal, social and emotional well-being.
- To provide an active and healthy start to the day for pupils through exercise and healthy eating through the school's before school kick start club.
- To encourage active lunchtimes for all pupils by encouraging the participation in sports and team games.
- Encourage pupils to have a voice in the development of sports across the school through the Sports Committee.

OFSTED will evaluate the impact that the sport's funding has had on pupils' lifestyles and physical well-being.

Membership cost for British Gymnastics Association	To ensure pupils receive their proficiency award and are able to enter competitions such as gym fusion. To ensure that pupils are assessed in Gymnastics to the British Gymnastics Standard and are awarded the correct proficiency stage from UFS to end of KS1.
