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| The past | The past is something that has already happened. |
| Chronology | Is where we put events in order throughout a period of time. |
| Significant people | Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole were both significant women who changed nursing. |
| Know and understand people's lives in Britain from the past. | Developing a deeper understanding of what life was like as a Victorian, especially for young children in school. |
| Finding out about the past. | Children develop an understanding of the ways in which we find out about the past. E.g. books, computers etc. |

| Impact/legacy | An event/part of history that continues to exist after it is over. |

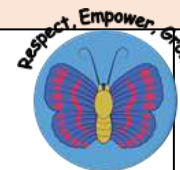
Key information: Florence Nightingale was a famous British nurse who lived from 1820-1910. She began her nursing career during the Crimean War. She would work all night to make sure the hospitals were clean and that the soldiers had what they needed, like water and warm blankets. She campaigned for cleaner and better hospitals and is recognised today for the changes she made. Many women wanted to become nurses after the work of Florence Nightingale.

This half term - As we continue to develop as historians through the topic of Florence we will be enhancing our understanding of the events that led to Florence Nightingale's lasting legacy and how her work at Scutari Hospital had an impact on nursing and how this continues today.
