

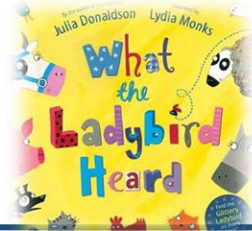
Understanding the World

What do you hope for?

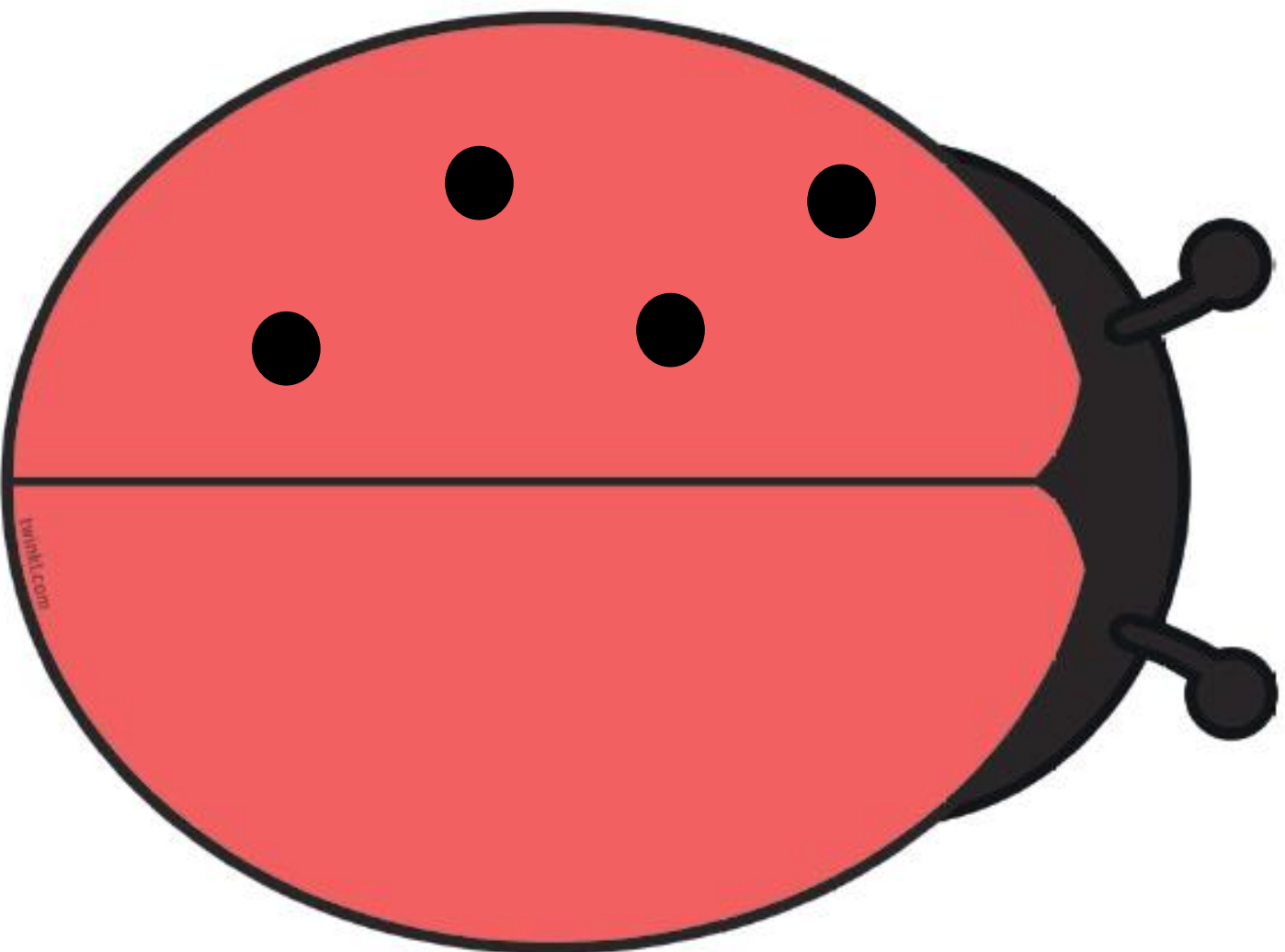
Mathematics learning

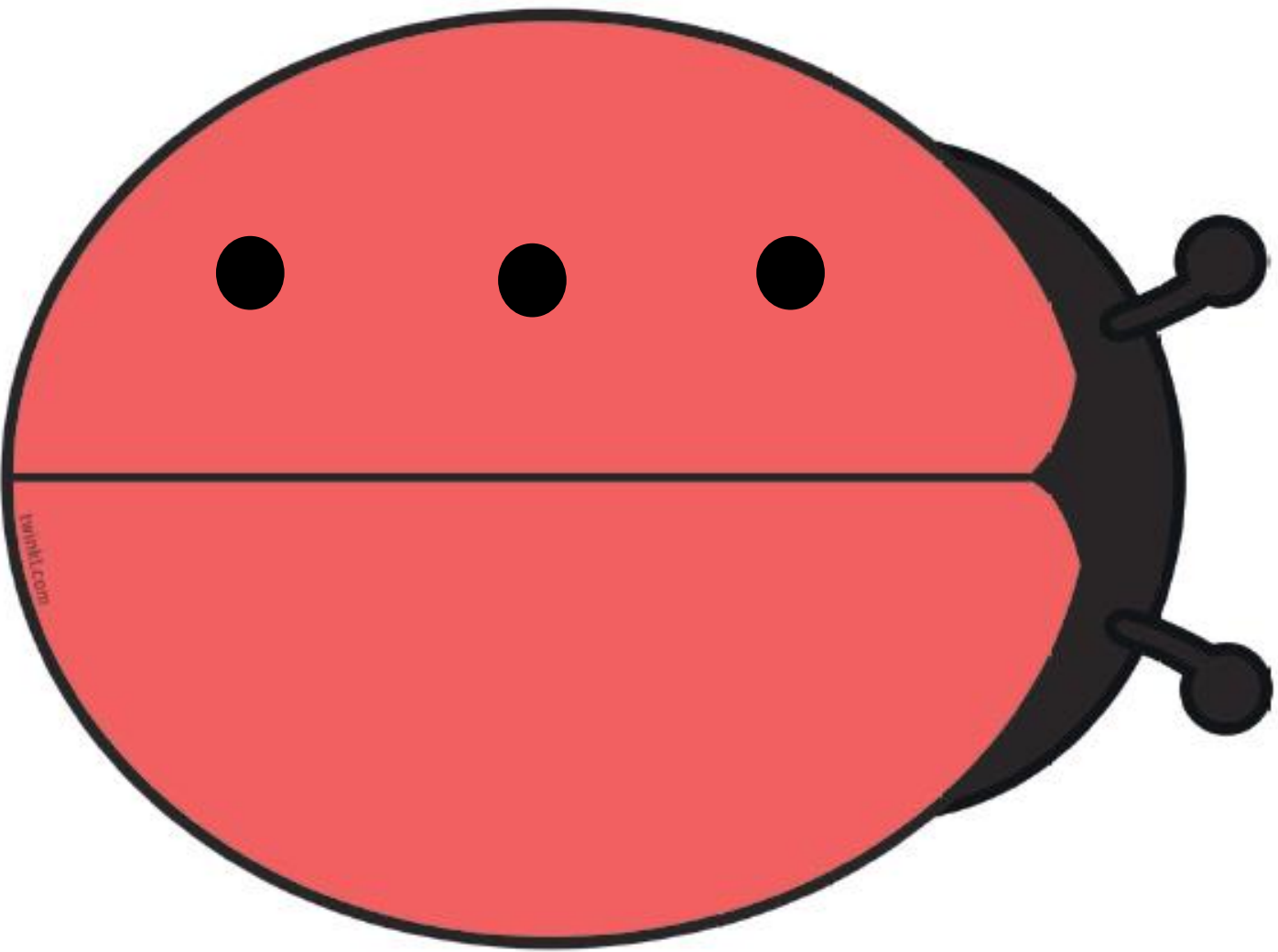

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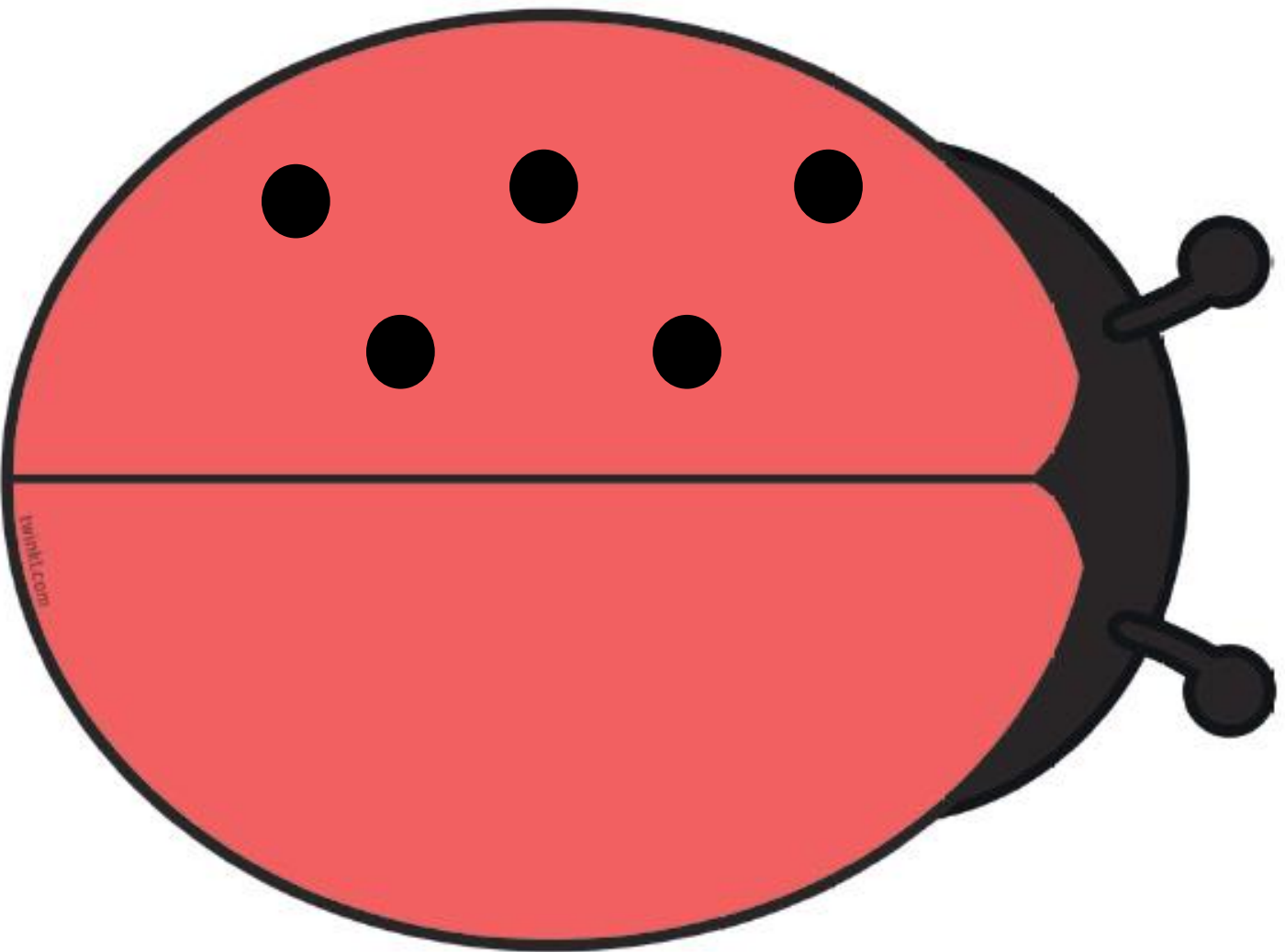

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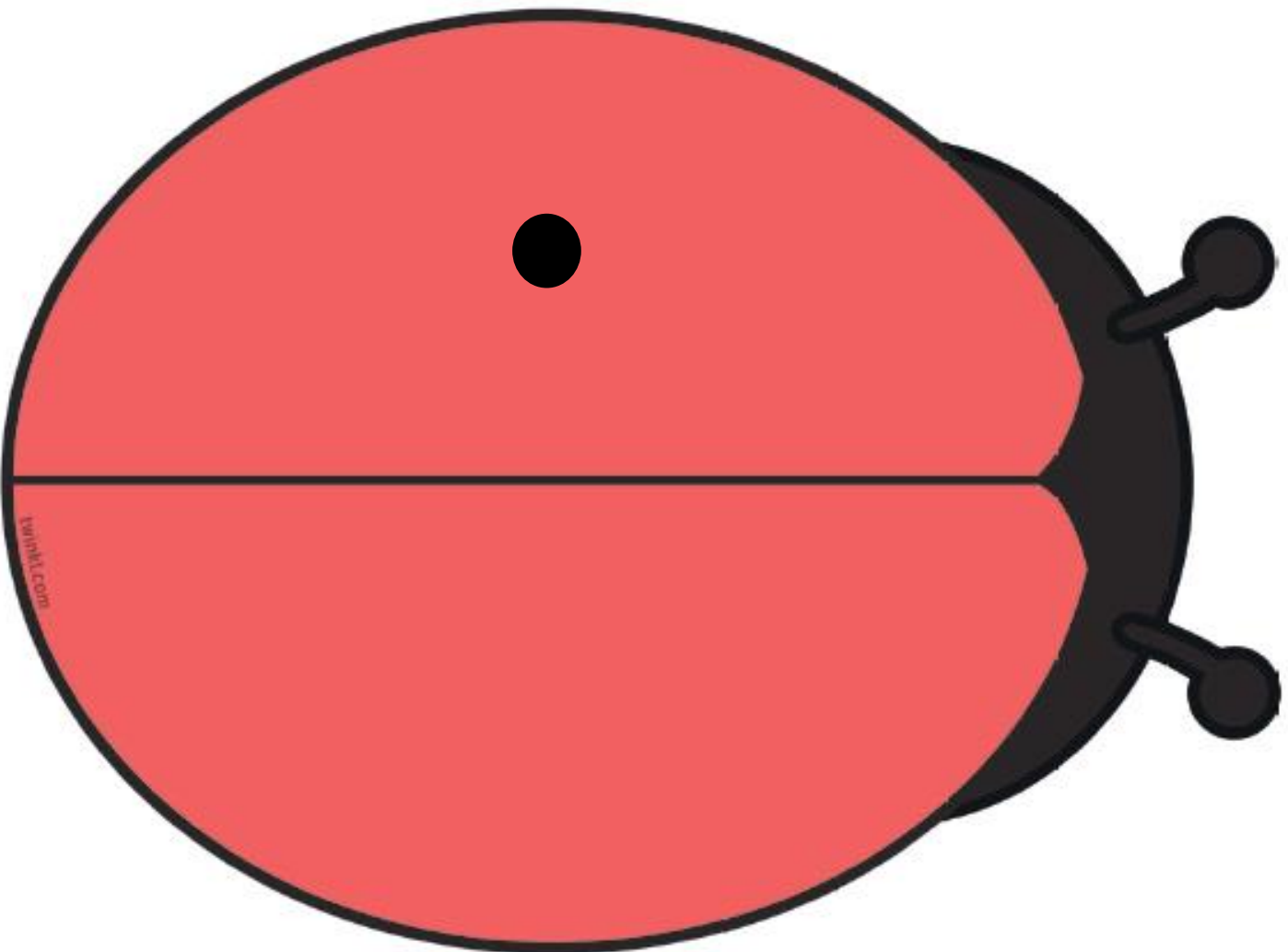

Learn all about the animals and tell the visitors lots of facts about them.



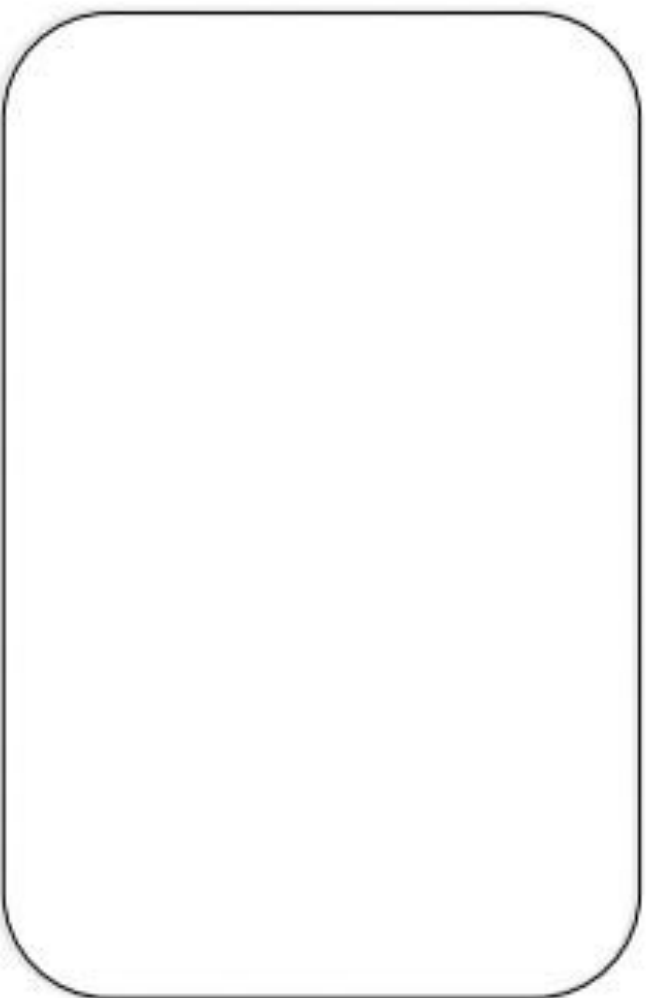


Use this sheet to let a grown-up write down all your thoughts on this week's story.
