Spending and impact report 2019-2020

From September 2013 the Government provided additional funding to schools to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. The Government is not dictating how schools should spend this money however schools will be accountable for how they spend their additional funding. The school receives a total sports premium funding of £17,758. OFSTED will evaluate the impact that the sport's funding has had on pupils' lifestyles and physical well-being.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the resulting school closures the funding allocation was not fully spent. Below are the details of the actual spend. Monies remaining will be carried forward to the spending 2020 - 2021.

In the academic year 2019-2020 the funding was allocated to be spent as follows:

- Hiring specialist qualified sports coaches to teach gymnastics and games across EYFS & KS1 alongside the teachers and support staff. This will improve pupils' knowledge, skills and understanding across the different strands of PE and will allow them to achieve highly.
- Ensure that continuing professional development opportunities are provided for all teachers and support staff through regular training and joint teaching led by coaches and the PE coordinator. This will improve the staff's knowledge, understanding and skills in teaching PE.
- PE subject leader to work closely alongside all teachers to ensure a broad, balanced and progressive curriculum is planned and delivered across the school. Completion of the long term progression plan for PE. Whole school CPD for PE to be delivered to increase staff's knowledge, understanding and skills in the teaching and assessment of PE and to ensure that there is clear progression across the school led by the PE subject leader.
- PE coordinator and team to work alongside other coordinators in the All Saints' partnership to plan and lead a range of sporting activities for pupils in Year 2 to participate and compete in alongside other schools. This project will also help build children's confidence and self-esteem.
- PE coordinator to continue to develop the school's football team through regular training and coaching. Participation in the school football tournament event alongside West Yorkshire Police.
- Continue to ensure that accurate assessment of gymnastics skills is in place to ensure pupils are progressing across the British Gymnastic Association stages and that they are achieving well.
- Involvement of pupils, alongside the caretaker and allocated support assistants, in maintaining the school grounds including the growing and cooking of a range of different healthy food choices and meals. This will also include a nurture group to focus on pupils' physical development but also their personal, social and emotional well-being.
- To provide an active and healthy start to the day for pupils through exercise and healthy eating through the before school 'kick start club' led by one of the school's HLTAs.
- To encourage active lunchtimes for all pupils by encouraging the participation in sports and team games.
- Encourage pupils to have a voice in the development of sports across the school through a newly established Sports Committee. Awards to be provided for sports in weekly celebration assembly.

Future spending: The external sports coach will be teaching in the EYFS for the next academic year. He will work closely alongside teachers including the NQT to ensure the quality of PE teaching and the opportunities for physical development remain outstanding. He will work across the school to ensure that progression plans for PE are in place and are being followed by teachers, ensuring PE is taught progressively and sequentially, building upon prior knowledge and skills. The PE team will continue to develop assessment systems with exemplification videos for teachers and support staff to use. The school will also use the sports funding to deliver after school sporting opportunities which are subsidised providing the opportunity for all pupils including those considered disadvantaged to attend once the whole school risk assessment deems it is safe to do so.
