


What key knowledge will we be teaching?

## World War Two

Evacuees	As historians, children will be learning about the evacuation of children from English cities to the countryside
Rationing	As historians, children will find out what rationing was, why it happened and what a weekly ration looked like.
Properties of materials	As scientists, children will investigate the best materials to make an Anderson shelter from, children will test the properties of materials including whether they are opaque or transparent, rigid or flexible and waterproof or absorbent.
The countries of the UK	As geographers, children will be learning and locating the four countries that make up the United Kingdom and each of their capital cities.
Who is a Muslim and what do they believe?	As spiritual learners, children will be learning about the Islamic faith, who follows it and why, and drawing some comparisons with Christianity.
Sculpture	As artists, children will learn about Barbara Hepworth and 'The Family of Man' sculptures, developing their sculpting techniques and then creating their own sculpture of the boy from 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne.
Publisher	As computer users, children will learn how to create, store and retrieve a document by creating a recruitment poster for the Women's Land Army.

Spelling	Definition
Evacuee (History)	An <b>evacuee</b> is someone who has been sent away from a dangerous place to somewhere safe, especially during a war.
Anderson Shelter (History)	A small air-raid shelter made of an arch of corrugated metal and designed to be partly buried in people's gardens and covered with earth for protection.
Opaque (Science)	If a material is <b>opaque</b> , you cannot see through it.
Rigid (Science)	A <b>rigid</b> material is stiff and does not bend, stretch, or twist easily.
Nation (Geography)	A <b>nation</b> is an individual country and its people. The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland is made up of 4 nations or countries.
