## In our school our teachers help us to keep safe by:

Leading assemblies about keeping safe and this includes inviting visitors such as the NSPCC to talk to us.

We have health and safety boards around school which have lots of information on about safety.

Mrs Ballance, our Learning Mentor, is always there to make sure we feel safe. Grown ups can talk to her too.

At playtimes and lunchtimes we have special rules to follow and safe zones to play in. If we are worried we can see a buddy or the mediator who will help solve our problems.

We learn how to keep safe through our RHE curriculum. In our classroom we have worry bins to write down our worries and help us forget about them.

We have school rules that are there to keep us safe at all times especially on the computers. We have SID's rules for keeping safe online.

#### Safe recruitment and selection of staff

### **Safeguarding statement**
