

In our school adults help to keep us safe. Adults include teachers, teaching assistants, volunteers and lunchtime supervisors. Here are a few ways they do this:

Leading assemblies about keeping safe and this includes inviting visitors such as the NSPCC to talk to us.

We have health and safety boards around school which have lots of information on about safety.

Mrs Ballance, our Learning Mentor, is always there to make sure we feel safe. Grown ups can talk to her too.

At playtimes and lunchtimes we have special rules to follow and safe zones to play in. If we are worried we can see a buddy or the mediator who will help solve our problems.

We learn how to keep safe through our RHE curriculum. In our classroom we have worry bins to write down our worries and help us forget about them.

We have school rules that are there to keep us safe at all times especially on the computers. We have SID's rules for keeping safe online.

Safe recruitment and selection of staff

Our school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. All posts are exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act, therefore all convictions must be declared. Providing false information is an offence. Appointed staff, governors, regular volunteers and trainees have identity, qualification and disclosure and barring checks and have been successfully cleared to work with children.

All visitors, including volunteers, must:

- Sign in and out at the main school office
- Wear the correct coloured lanyard
- Not use their mobile telephones within the school and store personal belongings away safely
- Work with the children in the designated spaces given by the staff
- Understand the need to be professional at all times and the need for confidentiality

Safeguarding statement

Through our day-to-day contact with pupils and direct work with families, staff have a crucial role to play in noticing indicators of possible abuse or neglect.
